Easter Sunday - April 12 - 10 am - Celebrate the presence of Risen Christ!



Darcy at the Senior Center is monitoring our older adult population in case they need a delivery or medicine. Social Services will pack items. Those who are able to pick up their items will do so by appointment only. Pickups are at the Community Center with the box picked up outside, to limit contact. We will accommodate those who need delivery. We are accepting donations of non-expired non-perishables by appointment only and only from the churches. Overflow perishable items are being stored at the Fire Safety Complex.

Support for those in need

The No Freeze Hospitality Shelter has closed. Those folks are now living outside. The food situation is also critical as some of them are too far from the Soup Kitchen and the Baptist church to walk for a meal.

If you have any of the following items at home already and would be willing to donate them, it would be very helpful.

- Blankets New or used and clean is great
- Tarps (especially 8/10 size)
- Rope to tie tarps into shelters
- Water & food individually packaged & non perishable such as lunchable tuna, single serving peanut butter and crackers, fruit, granola bars etc. (food that is nourishing and high calorie is ideal.)
- Disinfectant Wipes
